## WESTERN BALKANS: NEW EUROPEAN BIKE PATH LINKS 8 COUNTRIES

A month ago, a new European bike path was opened to the public, linking eight countries and becoming one of the most significant infrastructure initiatives on the continent. This path runs through the Western Balkans region and aims to promote bicycle tourism and strengthen the connection between these countries. The Trans Dinarica offers a unique experience focused on responsible tourism and sustainable economic development by showcasing towns and villages in the Balkans. This trail is intended for people who wish to explore lesser-known parts of the region, including the coast, forests, and inland towns. It is divided into 50 km sections, each ending at a place to eat and stay over the night.

The new bike route was completed at the end of June 2024. The launch will also feature a navigation package with all the information about points of interest, services, and accommodation along the route.

The project's developer has concentrated on promoting responsible travel that brings economic benefits to local communities in the region. The Trans Dinarica aims to showcase the beauty of these landscapes and create sustainable benefits for the areas it passes through.
