Observe Country-specific Laws and Rules

Since 2021, the same rules regarding the use of drones have generally applied throughout the EU. However, there may be country-specific differences and regional tightening of regulations. It is not uncommon for nature reserves to completely prohibit the use of drones. Violations often result in heavy fines or confiscation of the drone. It is recommended to check with the relevant tourism authorities in advance and pay attention to information signs on site.

Respect Privacy

Remember, aerial images can inadvertently capture a larger area than intended, potentially including people who prefer not to be photographed or filmed. Fly Safely in Unfamiliar Terrain

Strong winds, especially in coastal areas, can affect or even disrupt drones' flight behavior. **To** avoid accidents, it is recommended that drones be flown only in constant and good weather conditions. Flying a drone is similar to driving a car on unfamiliar roads; special terrain requires special caution to prevent incidents and damage to people or property.
