THE CROATIAN NATURAL JEWEL HAS SUDDENLY DISAPPEARED DUE TO MASS TOURISM



Croatia's coastline and its many islands are truly breathtaking. One of the most beautiful beaches in Europe, often regarded as a hidden gem, is Zlatni Rat on the island of Brač, commonly known as the "Golden Horn." The shape of Zlatni Rat is constantly changing due to the overall effects of wind, sea waves, and currents. This 500-meter-long pebble beach slopes gently into the sea west of Bol, creating an impressive natural spectacle as the elements reshape its appearance. Depending on the wind's direction, the beach's peak can tilt either east or west. **However, an autumn storm swept part of the famous "Golden Horn" into the sea.**

Photos of the lost landmark quickly spread on social media, shocking many islanders who had never witnessed anything like it. The beloved beach was hardly recognizable to them. Climate change was also cited as a factor contributing to this significant alteration.
